- **Community Testing:** Suffolk's first lateral flow test centre is now up and running at the University of Suffolk in Ipswich. Lateral flow testing is an important process that enables us to identify people who have the Covid-19 virus but do not show any symptoms – up to 1 in 3 of us. It is available to anybody who lives or works in the Ipswich area and is unable to work from home. Two new centres are due to open in the near future in Bury St Edmunds and Lowestoft, as part of a wider community testing strategy and they will play a huge part in preventing future spread of the virus.
