• **ESFA/AEB reconciliation for 2020-21 Update**: The ESFA confirmed a revised threshold for grant funded AEB providers for 20201-21 from 97% to 90%.

Community testing centres: These sites offer Lateral Flow COVID-19 Testing for people who cannot work from home and do not have symptoms of Covid-19. The test process takes about 15 minutes with the result provided via text within an hour. People are advised to get tested at least twice a week. At the moment, those who work from home should not leave home to get tested, unless they have symptoms.

Regular testing has a very significant role in helping Suffolk live with and manage Covid-19. One in three people who have Covid-19 have no symptoms at all, so regular testing is vital in breaking this invisible chain of infection.
