1. Introduction

Suffolk County Council's Adult Learning Service is grant funded from the Department for Education (DfE) and in accordance with the conditions of this grant the service will:

- Maximise access to adult skills and community learning for adults.
- Focus public funding on people who are disadvantaged and least likely to participate.
- Collect fee income from people who can afford to pay and use where possible to extend provision to those who cannot.
- Provide a service that maximises value for money and maintains the high quality.

This information applies to all learning starting on or after 1st August 2025.

To be entitled to DfE part or full funding, learners must meet the residency requirements set out in the [Adult skills fund: funding and performance management rules 2025 to 2026 - GOV.UK](#) (and subsequent updates to the Rules throughout the delivery period.) Any learners not meeting those requirements may still join one of the courses delivered by the Adult Learning Service but may need to pay the "full cost" fee for their learning.

Suffolk County Council subcontracts 100% of its delivery to 7 local training providers.
